OUR PROGRAMS

HAKU MO'OLELO (To "Compose Stories")

A parent-coaching curriculum designed for residents of the Women's Community Correctional Center (WCCC). Participants write, illustrate, and record their own children's storybooks, which are sent home to their children along with the audio recordings.

READERS RALLIES

A program for formerly homeless families living at Kahauiki Village, an affordable, plantation-style community. All residents are invited to quarterly readers rallies, which combine read-aloud activities with musical entertainment.

READ, REVIVE, RESTORE

A parent-coaching program for residents of State community correctional facilities to read and audio-record age-appropriate books for their children. Incarcerated parents record children's storybooks and send both the books and audio recordings to their children.

RTM10 ("READ TO ME 10 MINUTES A DAY")

Coaches provide parents with reading strategies and resources to practice in class, then apply it with their children at home and school.

RTM10 ALUMNI PROGRAMS

RTM10 program participants and their families engage in programming addressing their children's academic, social, and emotional needs.



OUR IMPACT

Between 2014 and 2020, the RTM10 (Read To Me 10 Minutes A Day) parent-coaching program has served 152 families who are now alumni of the program and have ongoing opportunities to participate in alumni programs and events. We asked our alumni to reflect and share their thoughts on the skills, strategies, and benefits they learned in class, and how it benefitted their children and family.
